WHAT ARE THE EFFECTS? Once inhaled, the chemicals are rapidly absorbed into the bloodstream through the lungs and travel quickly to the brain and the rest of the body 1 Most inhalants have an immediate effect (within seconds) but usually only provide a 'high' for a few minutes (although sometimes the effects can last several hours depending on
